<u>Ejercicio 1.</u> (Calificación máxima: 2 puntos)

Are the following statements TRUE or FALSE? Copy the evidence from the text. No marks are given for only TRUE or FALSE

- a) According to the text, dancing, and singing produce a stronger resistance to pain.
- b) In the investigation described in the text, tragic stories lead to a heightened sense of connection between people.

Solución:

- a) True (Paragraph 1 Line 3-5) " (...) activities like dancing, laughing and singing, they found that feel-good chemicals called endorphins were released in the brain, leading to increased pain tolerance."
- b) True (Paragraph 3 Line 19-22) "The results revealed that those who watched the traumatic film had a much stronger change to their moods and that their pain thresholds were boosted by nearly 18% as compared to the control scenario. They also had increased feelings of group bonding."

<u>Ejercicio 2.</u> (Calificación máxima: 2 puntos)

In your own words and based on the ideas in the text, answer the following questions. Do not copy from the text.

- a) Describe the pain tolerance test and its purpose
- b)Give two reasons why the researchers consider that watching dramatic films may be good for you.

Solución:

- a) The purpose of the study was to check if watching a tragic film would lead to increase pain tolerance. 169 people took part of the study. They were divided in two groups: one watched a dramatic film called "Stuart: A Life Backwards" and the other watched an archeology documentary. Some participants also did a wall-sit test to measure their pain tolerance.
- b) According to the scientists, watching a dramatic film will not only be good for your health, because it helps to increase your pain tolerance, but also helps to create connection with other people.
